#### C. Revision of The Associate Degree Pattern

Fullerton College's revised Associate Degree proposal involves the completion of 8 courses in the following 7 areas, with a minimum of 22 semester units of general education in the areas described below, along with other graduation requirements for the Associate in Arts or Associate in Science Degree.

- Area 1: English Composition, Oral Communication, and Critical Thinking (6+ units)
- Area 2: Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning (3+ units)
- Area 3: Arts and Humanities (3+ units)
- Area 4: Social and Behavioral Sciences (3+ units)
- Area 5: Natural Sciences (3+ units)
- Area 6: Ethnic Studies (3+ units)
- Area 7: Lifelong Learning and Self-Development (1-4 units)

\*Area 7 will be a local requirement. Students will select one course: one Physical Activity course (or its equivalent), or one course chosen from the previous (2019-2025) Associate Degree pattern's "Area E, Lifelong Learning and Self-Development."

#### VIII. Discussion

#### A. Common Course Numbering

The committee raised concerns regarding the configuration of Banner to meet the new Common Course Numbering (CCN) directive, and a formal inquiry was made to Ellucian for a viable solution. However, Ellucian's response was perceived as lacking in receptiveness to the requested support. Consequently, the committee identified this as an ongoing challenge that may require further advocacy. The CIO association is getting the Banner schools together to address the need for a permanent, viable solution directly with Ellucian CEO. The District and the colleges are participating in this ad hoc advocacy group.

The committee discussed challenges with the new common course numbers on student transcripts, particularly regarding clarity and consistency for student mobility and external interpretation of records. The Chair will be convening a DW ad hoc workgroup to analyze these issues and recommend solutions for smoother CCN integration into academic and administrative systems.

Committee agreed to create a new catalog landing page to be placed in the side nav bar to provide students with information regarding the changes to CCN affected courses. In addition to descriptive information, the landing page will list all currently approved common courses for Cypress and Fullerton Colleges.

#### B. Curriculum Management Tool

The committee acknowledged the need for a robust solution for managing the curriculum inventory. The Vice President of Instruction from Cypress College reported on an upcoming visit from a representative of CurricUNET, who will provide a demonstration of their latest product, CurricUNET Maverick. Following discussion, the committee reached consensus that any tool under consideration must, as a fundamental criterion, demonstrate compatibility with the Banner system to ensure seamless integration across institutional platforms.
