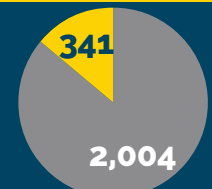

Billion Added Income

In FY 2020-21, NOCCCD added **\$2.0** billion in income to the Orange County economy, a value approximately equal to 0.7% of the county's total gross regional product (GRP).
