Sittens' Overston: Committee Meriors use of Freesure X funds


The NOCCCD Citizens' Oversight Committee meets four times a year to review the District's compliance with the voter-approved plans for Measure X funds.

We are renovating three major college campuses in the North Orange County Community College District (NOCCCD) while classes and learning continue for our 69,000-plus students at any given time. This may not be easy, but it certainly is invigorating!

Voter approval of Measure X in 2002 is empowering us to make extensive improvements while preserving the historic nature of Fullerton College, the oldest continuously operating community college in the state. An "Extreme Make-over" also is underway at Cypress College, which recently celebrated its 40th anniversary, and the School of Continuing Education, which is the fourth largest program of its kind in California.

Many people in our District are working together to coordinate the Measure X projects. They include specialists in our Finance and Facilities Department as well as leaders, faculty, and other staff members on each of our campuses. During these past five years, we have become well acquainted with officials at the Department of the State Architect, where building plans must be approved. Some of us on the academic side of our organization also have become a lot more educated in building planning and construction than we ever imagined we would.

The refinancing of the bonds and thoughtful, ongoing investment of all proceeds within the Measure X program in our District also have resulted in significant interest earnings, increasing our program funds from \$239,000,000 up to \$265,846,752. This additional \$26.8 million is being used to help offset escalating construction costs and also to cover the District's commitment in shared or matching fund projects.

Yes, progress can be seen – and heard! – in many ways throughout the NOCCCD.

Reminders of this are all around us, including the drilling and pounding just a few floors below me as I sign-off on this latest progress report to you.

Beyond Measure X, our District was "ready to go" with three state-approved projects when another funding opportunity arose in the last general election. With passage of Proposition 1D: Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond of 2006, the NOCCCD received almost \$88 million for three buildings. Our funding allocation was the second highest among the state's 72 community college districts, partly because of the advance work done by our staff.
