

Fullerton College Ranks 6th in Awarding Transfer Degrees

Beginning in 2012, the associate degree for transfer (ADT) guarantees community college students priority admission to a Cal State University with junior standing.

At Fullerton College, 552 ADT's were awarded to students during the 2014-15 academic year—an increase of 158 ADT's from the year prior.

This impressive increase ranked the College in 6th place among the 113 California community colleges and a statewide commendation for their hard work, from The Campaign for College Opportunity and the California Business Roundtable.

Paving the Road to Bachelor's Degrees at Community Colleges

According to the Public Policy Institute of California, the State will need approximately 1 million more workers with bachelor's degrees by 2025. To help alleviate this shortage, Cypress College is one of 15 community colleges to take part in the baccalaureate degree pilot program. Additionally, NOCCCD—under the direction of **Dr. Joyce Carrigan**, Dean of the Baccalaureate Degree Pilot Program—is tasked with overseeing a \$750,000 state-wide grant to ensure their success.

Dr. Carrigan and her team are planning an all-day summit for representatives from the 15 pilot programs on July 6 at Cal State Fullerton (CSUF). “We’re leading the charge in this brand new, first-of-its-kind opportunity in California,” said Dr. Carrigan. “My hope is that this is just the beginning of a seamless transition for community college students who want to pursue a four-year degree.”
